Getting here

The Cambridge Sports Centre is located on the West Cambridge site, Philippa Fawcett Dr, Cambridge CB3 0AS.

A member of Cambridge Festival staff will be outside the main entrance of the sports centre to greet and direct you.

Coaches can drop off students outside the front entrance of the sports centre.

Madingley Road Park & Ride provides coach parking for £10 per day which needs to be booked in advance. Please see here for further details.

When to arrive

Please be seated 15 minutes before the talk starts. We will have volunteers and staff on site in coloured Cambridge Festival T-shirts/hoodies to welcome you.

Where can we have lunch?

There are a number of green, outdoor spaces for lunch if the weather is agreeable. There are a few picnic benches and a green space outside the Hauser Forum building. There are also toilets and a small café (West Café) just inside the building on the ground floor.

Alternatively, there's a larger green space with no benches on Charles Babbage Road.

The <u>West Hub</u> offers ample indoor space for students to eat lunch indoors. There's also a well-sized café, water fountains and toilets. You are free to use any of the seating and do not need to book in advance to use the West Hub for lunch.
